- The Queensland Cricket Code of Behaviour applies to:
 - All Queensland Cricket competitions
 - All registered players and officials
 - "Officials" = manager, coach, medical, fitness staff, selectors,
 official of QC or Premier Cricket club, and...
 - UMPIRES!





- Some sections of the Code of Behaviour apply at all times:
 - 1[b][v] "...conduct detrimental to the game..."
 - 1[b][vii] "...racial or religious abuse or harassment..."
 - 1[b][viii] "...public or media comment which is detrimental to the interests of the game..."

Note: Public comment includes comment on Club websites and other electronic media.





- Other sections of the Code of Behaviour apply whether participating or spectating at any match under the auspices of CA or QC:
 - 1[b][i] "...abuse cricket equipment or clothing, ground equipment or fixtures and fittings..."
 - 1[b][ii] "...assault or attempt to assault..."
 - 1[b][iii]"...react with dissension...towards an umpire, their decision, or generally, following an umpiring decision..."
 - 1[b][iv]"...crude or abusive language, or...conduct detrimental to the spirit of the game..."
 - 1[b][vi] "...crude or abusive hand signals..."





As umpires, our role is to:

- Observe
- Act
- Report





Reporting an alleged breach of the Code of Behaviour

- Alleged breaches should be reported via e-form:
 - www.qldcricket.com.au/cobreport

Timeframes:

- If safe to do so, advise captains of lodgment or pending lodgment of report as soon as practical – either on-field or at close of day's play.
- Complete report by 4:30pm Monday after match completion.

Note: umpires should still submit even if timeframe has passed.



- During the 21st over of the W Point innings Mr H was batting and faced a delivery from Liam F . Mr H hit the ball directly back to the bowler, who cleanly caught the ball close to the ground and appealed for caught and bowled. I gave Mr H out and raised my finger to indicate this. ease select the relevant section/s of the Code of Behaviour that the player/official has eached: *
[a] The captains are responsible at all times for ensuring that play is conducted within the spirit of the game as well as within the Laws.
[b] [i] Players and officials must not abuse cricket equipment or clothing, ground equipment or fixtures and fittings.
[b] [ii] Players and officials must not assault or attempt to assault an umpire, a player, an official or spectator.
[b] [iii] Players and officials must not react with unnecessary obvious dissension, displeasure or disapproval either towards an umpire, his decision, or generally, following an umpiring decision.
[b] [iv] Players and officials must not use crude or abusive language, or otherwise engage in conduct detrimental to the spirit of the game. An umpire would be expected to caution the player and advise the captain of his concern before reporting any player for this type of behaviour.
[b] [v] Players and officials must not indulge in conduct detrimental to the game.
[b] [vi] Players and officials must in no way use crude or abusive hand signals.
[b] [vii] Players and officials must not engage in any form of racial or religious abuse or harassment as defined in the Queensland Cricket Racial and Religious Vilification Code, the Cricket Australia Racial and Religious Vilification Code or Anti-Harassment Policy.
[b] [viii] Without limiting any other rule, players and officials must not make public or media comment which is detrimental to the interests of the game.





Queensland Cricket Breach of Code of Behaviour Report Form
* Required
NOTES TO REPORTING OFFICIALS:
Where an umpire does not consider that the alleged breach exceeds Level 1, they shall speak to the player regarding their behaviour, the incident will be noted on this form and the player will receive a caution. The umpire must also inform the captain/s as soon as practical, either on the field or at the close of a day's play. The umpires must complete this form prior to 4:30pm Monday after the completion of the match.
26. Indicate the nature of ALL Level 1 breaches by selecting the relevant Code of Behaviour offence/s:
1.1 Abuse cricket equipment or clothing, ground equipment or fixtures and fittings;
1.2 Show dissent at an umpire's decision by action or verbal abuse;
1.3 Use language that is obscene, offensive or insulting and/or the making of an obscene gesture;
1.4 Engage in excessive appealing;
1.5 Point or gesture towards the pavilion in an aggressive manner upon the dismissal of a batsman;
1.6 Breach any regulation regarding approved clothing or equipment;
1.7 Disobey an umpire's instruction during a match;



3.3 Use language or gestures that offend, insult, humiliate, threaten, disparage or vilify another person on the basis of that person's race, religion, colour, descent or national or ethnic origin;
3.4 Physically assault another player, umpire, referee, official or spectator;
3.5 Engage in any act of violence on the field of play;
3.6 Change the condition of the ball in breach of Law 41.3.
3.7 Make public or media comment detrimental to the interests of the game


















- What happens once the report is completed?
