PRESIDENT'S ANNUAL REPORT

On behalf of the Management Committee of the Queensland Sub Districts Cricket Association Inc. (QSDCA), it is with great pleasure that I submit for your consideration the Annual Report and Financial Statements covering the activities of the QSDCA for the 2021/2022 season.

This season was a watershed season for QSDCA which saw a massive expansion in the number of competitions that its teams participated in.

QSDCA provided cricket for 44 Saturday teams competing in 7 Grades, 7 Saturday teams in the Community Cricket Championships, 12 teams in 2 Grades for the Sunday 50 Overs Competition, 11 teams for the Sunday T20 Competition, 6 teams in the composite Junior Bridging Competition and 6 teams in the Over 40 Competition as well as 1 team entered into the Plunkett Cup Representative Competition. That is a total of 87 teams.

These teams represented 40 individual clubs and the matches were spread over 38 grounds.

Further details on the various competitions are covered under separate headings later in this report.



SEASON FORMAT

As mentioned earlier QSDCA had an increase in the number of competitions that were run as well as teams being entered into the Community Cricket Championships (CCC).

QSDCA Saturday Competition

The season was extended from 23 weeks to 24 weeks to be in sync with the CCC Competition.

With seven QSDCA teams playing in the CCC competition, our Saturday competition started with B1 grade as the highest grade. There were 3 B grades and 4 C grades catering for 42 teams.

The season started with 3 rounds of one-day limited over matches, followed by 5 two-days matches, then a one-day fixture up to the two weeks Christmas Break followed by 5 two-day matches to round off the season.

CCC Saturday Competition

In February 2020 a meeting was held between the four leading Warehouse clubs and QSDCA representatives. The seed was sown for the formation of a separate competition for the leading QSDCA and Warehouse clubs. However, Covid intervened and the idea was put on the back burner.

In the winter of 2021 the idea was resurrected and a meeting convened at Qld Cricket between Warehouse and our representatives (Mark Irwin, Adam Brady and Bruce Lawson). The outcome was the formation of the Community Cricket Championships.

Queensland Cricket provided the 4 piece Kookaburra balls as assistance to the new organisation.

QSDCA provided 4 of the 8 teams in CCC First Grade (Indooroopilly District, Coorparoo, Ashgrove and Cleveland Thornlands) and 3 of the 6 teams in CCC Second Grade (Brookfield United, Indooroopilly District and Everton District).

QSDCA teams were Premiers in both grades with Coorparoo winning First Grade and Brookfield United winning Second Grade.

QSDCA Saturday Competition

QSDCA had 42 teams playing in 7 grades – B1, B2, B3, C1, C2, C3 and C4.

As mentioned previously the season was extended by 1 week to align with the CCC competition.

There did not seem to be any issues with this new format.

All grades were keenly contested finals placings were undecided until after the completion of fixtures in all but 2 grades.

It is hoped that the advent of the CCC competition will add some incentive for the clubs in these grades to aspire to higher grades.

Mel Lowings Cup

The Mel Lowings Cup was expanded to 12 teams split into A Grade and B Grade. This 50 over competition has now consolidated into a popular series with more and more teams showing interest.

Played over alternate Sundays the competition caters for those teams and players who cannot commit to cricket each weekend as well as those players who cannot get enough cricket.

Kookaburra Cup Super 20 Competition

This long established T20 competition was keen contested by 11 teams split over 2 grades. It was run on alternate Sundays to the Mel Lowings Cup.

QSDCA Over 40's Competition

This is a new competition that was hastily assembled by Committeeman Geoff Doyle.

Geoff was able to get 6 teams to create the competition. The quality of most teams was of a high standard with quite a number of ex Premier grade players involved.

Teams were easily filled and we are confident that we can get more teams for the forthcoming season.

QSDCA Bridging Competition

Another new competition to cater for those junior club players who want to play 2 day cricket without having to commit to the regime of the Grade scene.

The competition was played over 5 two days matches in the lead up to Christmas 2021. The format was "quarters" cricket where each team was limited to 35 overs per innings each days.

Another feature was the regulation that allowed 3 or 4 senior players to play in each team as mentors.

Special thanks to Michael Fisher for his work in creating this competition.

Plunkett Cup

QSDCA provides the opportunity for players to play representative cricket through our providing a team to play for the Plunkett Cup.

The Plunkett Cup Competition has been in existence for a number of years and is in a 50 Overs one-day format. This season teams from Warehouse Cricket, Logan District Cricket, Ipswich Cricket Association together with QSDCA played against each other for the Plunkett Cup. This season each team played 3 matches.

Unfortunately, QSDCA had a poor season and finished in last place.

QSDCA is indebted to the Rochedale South Cricket Club for making their facilities available for our home matches over a number of years. Special mention and sincere thanks go to Denis Golinski for his selecting of the teams, following up on players availability and organising the team for these matches. Denis becomes and is an important part of this team.



GROUNDS

The Association used 38 grounds throughout the season.

We lost the use of Bowman Park for the first time in over 100 years. Bowman Park has been the home ground of West Brisbane CC for this period but are being nudged out by the resident Soccer club. We hope that we can gain access to the ground for next season but that is only a slim chance.

Taringa Rovers CC had similar issues with Jack Speare Park with the resident Soccer club permitting only 5 cricket matches for the season. We are working with Queensland Cricket with the hope of preventing further similar occurrences. The use of Indooroopilly High School as a Covid test facility saw the venue lost to cricket for a considerable part of the season.

Football again ran late and moved into the early part of our season once again. As a result, we were forced to hire grounds at Marchant Park from Warehouse Cricket on occasions. This uncertainty meant that we could only set fixtures 2 to 3 weeks in advance during the first half of the season.

In general, most cricket pitches were of good quality and we thank the many volunteers involved.



UMPIRES

Umpire numbers increased to 26 for the season.

It is pleasing to report that of this number there were 4 new umpires.

We would like to thank Matthew Skinner from Queensland Cricket for his work in umpire recruitment. With the CCC competition requiring 2 umpires in each of the First Grade matches we need to increase our numbers.

Thanks go to Mel Johnson for his wise counsel and knowledge in the monthly umpire meetings. We are lucky to have somebody of Mel's experience to chair these sessions.

Umpire observations were carried out by Mel Johnson and Jim Torpey. Their detailed reports were of great assistance to our umpires. Thank you Mel and Jim.

CONDUCTS SUB COMMITTEE

Captains and players are responsible for the conduct of their players on and off the field and when, sometimes, behaviour of players is not appropriate, the umpires have a duty to report this conduct so the players, the captains and the clubs are aware of their continuing responsibility to the game and each other.

This year, a Conducts Liaison position was created on the Management Committee in order to improve the clarity and transparency of the Conducts process in the games the Association manages and runs.

79 teams play each weekend (across Saturdays and Sundays), which means there are 869 individuals playing QSDCA cricket per week. If we equate this over the season, there are over 11,000 “players” out on the field over the season.

There were 30 instances across the entire season where players were seen to “overstep” the mark and were reported for their poor conduct. Whilst this is a small percentage overall, such instances reduce the enjoyment of all participants in the game.

The vast majority of players play the game with a positive spirit. Teams like Wellington Point B2s, Cleveland Thornlands CCC 1st grade, Indooroopilly Districts CCC 2nd grade were rated very highly by umpires in terms of the spirit they demonstrate all season. The role of conducts, ideally, would be to celebrate these consistently high performing teams.

QSDCA Management Committee is committed to supporting umpires and working with the Queensland Cricket Commissioners to ensure that those reported for breaches of the playing code of conduct are educated in terms of how they should behave and that players, captains and umpires are all playing and behaving to the highest standards.

PRESENTATION OF AWARDS EVENING

The presentation evening was held at the Queensland Cricketers’ Club at the GABBA and was attended by many teams and representatives of clubs.

This year, Greg Chappell and Jeff Thomson, rather than presenting speeches, were interviewed by our MC Evan “Banger” Bancroft and the two speakers spoke of their time in the limelight with openness.

We were also delighted to have the Deputy Chair of Queensland Cricket Kirsten Pike and Kookaburra Sports representative Liam De Jong in attendance to present trophies. Unfortunately, some award winners were not present and in future players will be informed of their awards to ensure that are able to be presented with their awards at the presentation.

We thank our major sponsors: Kookaburra Sport, Queensland Cricketers Club, Keith Dudgeon Sports, Queensland Cricket and Aqua Fresh for supporting the night as well as all those players, club members, volunteers and administrators who help our QSDCA thrive.





MANAGEMENT COMMITTEE

The Management Committee met at least every month, if not in person, then by Zoom.

The new normal created by COVID was well handled by the Management Committee.

Once again the Management Committee engaged the services of Michael Fisher. Some of the projects that the Management Committee have engaged him to do are to set up a sub-committee profile for QSDCA and to engage with our clubs to help with the roles of the various sub committees. One highlight that came out of this project is that, like many other groups, the Committee is very much overloaded with work in organising and running the Association.

As you can see the Management committee has been very pro-active over the last 12 months with the consolidation of the Saturday and Sunday competitions and the creation of the Over 40's and Bridging competitions.

Special thanks go to Mark Irwin for his management of our Cricket Operations Sub Committee and Geoff Doyle for setting up the Over 40 competition.

We cannot forget the volumes of work done by our Assistant Secretary, Anthony Martin. Without his input the jobs of our other Committee Members would be so much more difficult if not impossible to carry out.

I thank those members of the Committee and hope that other QSDCA members will look to serve on the Committee for the coming seasons.

QSDCA has established an Over 40's Competition as well a Junior Bridging competition with some senior players in each team to act as playing mentors.

This is separate to the Community Cricket Championship that had seven teams competing in.

There has been a lot happening at Management Committee level.
