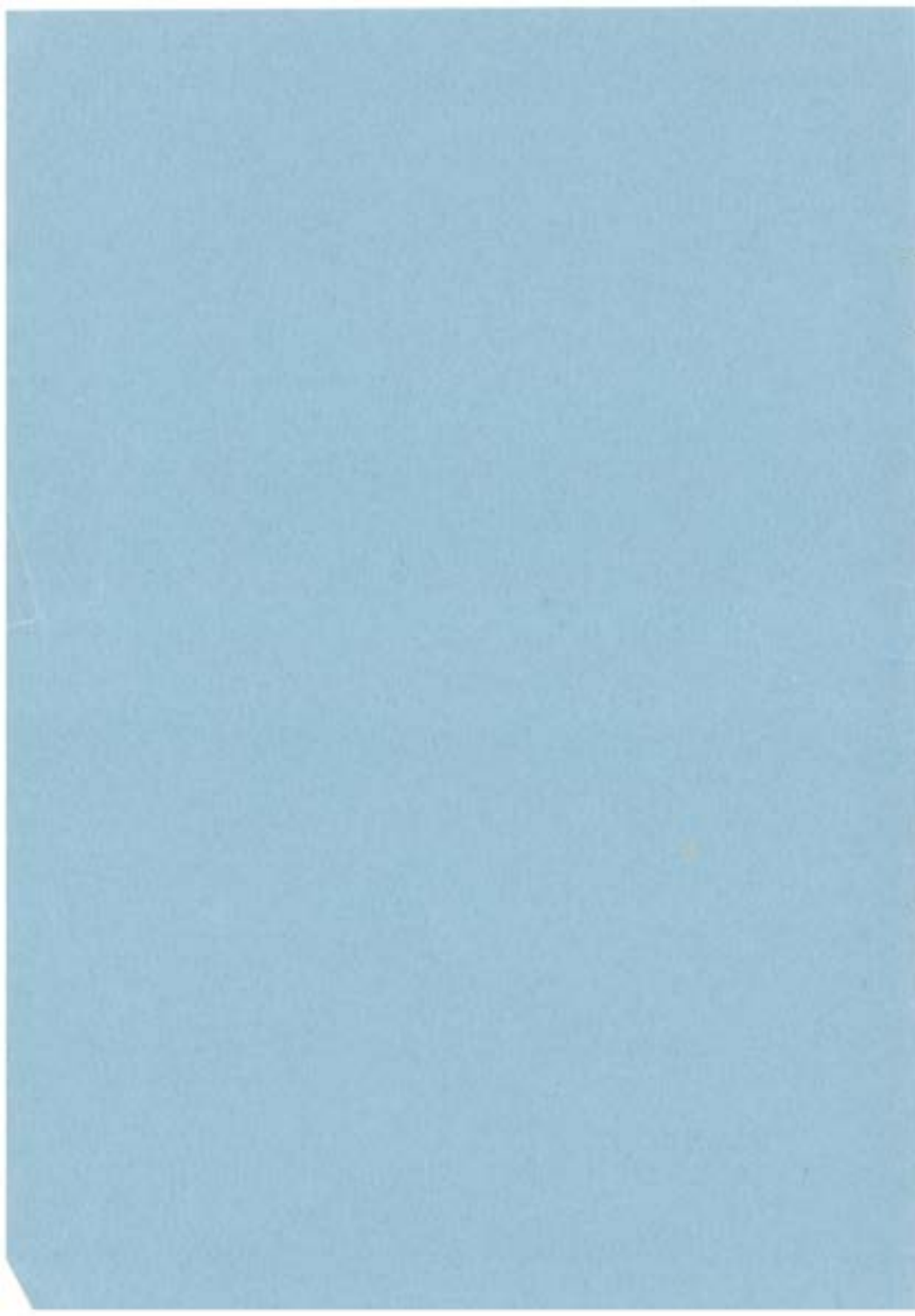

PRESIDENT'S ANNUAL REPORT

On behalf of the Management Committee of the Queensland Sub Districts Cricket Association Inc. , I take pleasure in presenting for your consideration the Annual Report and Financial Statements covering our activities for the 2000/2001 season.

Nominations were received from 19 clubs, which saw 48 teams accepted over seven grades. Subsequently, two teams withdrew leaving 46 to compete.

We welcomed St. Brendan's Club and must acknowledge the hard work by them to achieve use of their wicket at Kookaburra Park. We also had the use of Windsor Park where the Gap Club has a very satisfactory arrangement with St. Margaret's School.

Over the past few seasons we have participated in the Webb Shield Competition giving players the opportunity to experience representative cricket. The Management Committee made the decision to participate this season in the Plunkett Cup Competition instead.

We were successful in winning the Cup by defeating Beaudesert, the holders, at their home ground. Apart from congratulating the players, thanks must go to Kevin Haley, Greg Rogers and Denis Golinski, who all played a big part in selections and ensuring the organisation of the match teams.

Our other annual representative matches were against Public Service, where we won one and lost the other, Public Service thus retaining the Jim Noble Shield.

The Annual Seven-a-Side Competition was not played this year due to lack of the required number of nominations.

This season saw us tested in having semi-finals followed by the final in each grade.

There are many arguments both for and against the playing of semi-finals and I am sure the subject will be covered in discussion again.

Congratulations to Northern Ramblers Club who came from third place, had to win outright in the semi-final and in the final and achieved the premiership in C3 grade.

Further congratulations also to Rochedale South Club, who competed in five grades, and achieved two premierships and one minor premiership - their A2 premiership winning side was undefeated through the season.

Our Annual Dinner and Trophy Presentation Night was held at the Taringa Soccer Club.

Approx. 130 attended an enjoyable evening - guests included the President of Queensland Cricket, Mr. John McKnoulty.

In conclusion, I wish to congratulate the premiership winning teams as well as all trophy winners and those individuals with outstanding performances as listed elsewhere in this report.

GROUNDS

However a new wicket block at Wally Tate Park (Rosedale South) was not used due to a delay in preparation.

Unfortunately, some Sunday games had to be played during the season due to a shortage of grounds in some rounds. This may not be a problem in the coming season.

During the season, clubs purchased ride-on mowers with financial assistance from grants - this has reduced the incidence of playing in long grass with only three grounds not having the facility for mowing independently from the city council.

Once again, our thanks to curators for their weekly preparation of pitches. It is a measure of their dedication that very few complaints were received about the standard of the pitches.

ABSTRACTS

The duties of Abstract Inspector was once again capably carried out by Greg Rogers. A new method of transmitting abstract details by E-mail was started this season and many clubs used the E-mail to send their results. However, some clubs were slow in sending in their abstracts - this is frustrating to the recorder as points etc cannot be finalised until the official results are received.

UMPIRES

The season commenced with six umpires available. Despite an initial concerted effort by advertising etc to recruit umpires, an average of nine umpires only were available during the season. Regretably, QCUA umpires were rarely available as their numbers were also reduced - however, available QSDCA umpires were supplemented by QCUA umpires in the finals.

Sadly, we lost Parry Scott in December due to cancer. Parry was one of the hardest workers in umpire appointments, advising changes in rules and general organisation. He decided to stand down at the beginning of the season due to health reasons. In the previous season, Parry spent many hours trying to increase umpire numbers, coaching and instructing - he will be missed.

The management committee still aims to have all matches covered by badged umpires and intends to actively recruit additional umpires for the coming season.

Past players are welcome to join the ranks and continue with their involvement in the game.

ANNUAL DINNER AND TROPHY PRESENTATION

The Annual Dinner and Trophy Presentation was held at Taringa Soccer clubhouse on Saturday, 21st April.

Approx 130 players, officials and guests attended (including the President of Queensland Cricket, Mr. John McKnulty, Life Members and supporters of the Association) and were entertained by the M.C. / comedian, Lindsay Webb.

The Presentation of Premiership Perpetual Shields (with replica shields to be retained by the Premiership Clubs) Premiership Caps and individual player awards was carried out during the evening. Players in the winning Plunkett Cup team were presented with special caps together with a small memento to remember an enjoyable representative season.

Our thanks to Bruce Lawson for organising the evening and obtaining sponsorships to help us celebrate the occasion. We are indebted to our sponsors for their generosity - Castlemaine Perkins XXXX, Heritage Building Society, Sheraton Hotel, Keith Dudgeon Sports and Queensland Cricket.

FINANCE

The attached financial statements show an operating cash surplus of \$5155.37 (excluding provision for depreciation). Cash at bank increased by \$4874, investment account increased by \$388, debtors decreased by \$106, whilst fixed assets decreased by \$650 as a provision for depreciation. Fines totalling \$1483 were paid by clubs. The system of rendering accounts to clubs continues to operate efficiently.

QUEENSLAND CRICKET

Our Association continues to have an excellent relationship with Queensland Cricket, and our thanks are recorded to the President, Board of Directors, Chief Executive and Staff for support and help during the period.

The Annual General Meeting, Secretaries' meeting and Monthly Delegates' Meetings were held in excellent facilities in the Ian Healy Room at Headquarters, Albion.

Queensland Cricket paid a special grant of \$2500 from the proceeds of match day "bat" raffles - we acknowledge the untiring efforts of Peter Stathis in selling tickets over the years to bring about this contribution to our finances.

MANAGEMENT COMMITTEE

At the last Annual General Meeting, Ken Thompson did not seek re-election after many years on the Management Committee (including some years as President). Denis Golinski and Rod Taylor were elected as new members on the committee.

Daniel Moore resigned during the season due to re-locating to work in England.

Our thanks to Ken and Danny for their time and effort on the Management Committee.

CONCLUSION

The past season once again has been one of consolidation with nineteen clubs and forty-six teams participating. It is pleasing to see that the number of younger players is increasing. Some years ago there were only a few nominations for the the most promising Under 21 player -this year the committee had a difficult task due to the number and quality of eligible players.

It is also pleasing to record that only one case came before the Conducts Committee during the past season, although some minor breaches of player conduct were reported and letters of reprimand sent to the offending players.

My thanks to the members of the Management Committee and to all club Officials and players for their assistance in making this third year as President an enjoyable and rewarding one.


