PRESIDENT'S ANNUAL REPORT

On behalf of the Management Committee of the Queensland Sub Districts Cricket Association Inc., I present for your consideration the Annual Report and Financial Statements covering our activities for the 2023/2024 Cricket Season.

After serving on the Management Committee for the best part of 30 years it was an honour to be elected President following the retirement of Mel Lowings.

A total of 91 teams, from clubs affiliated with QSDCA, participated throughout the season in 16 grades spread over 6 competitions on Saturdays and Sundays.

A total of 1802 players were registered with QSDCA for the season. Saturday matches were played in 9 grades as one-day and two-day matches, as scheduled.

Sunday matches saw two grades in each of the Kookaburra Cup Super 20, the Mel Lowings Cup 50 Over and the Geoff Doyle Cup Over 40 Competitions being played on alternate Sundays.

It was pleasing to see and increase in teams for the Sunday competitions. Congratulations go to all Premiership winners. Further details are listed later in this report.

SEASON FORMAT

On Saturdays, the season was played over 24 weekends with 8 QSDCA affiliated teams playing in the CCC competition in 1st Grade and 2nd Grade and 44 teams playing in 7 grades from B1 to C4 grade.

Community Cricket Championship Saturday Competition

The Community Cricket Championship (CCC) completed its third season in 2023/24. This is a contest between the best teams of various community cricket competitions – at this stage QSDCA and Warehouse.

There were two grades (First Grade and Second Grade) with 6 teams in 1st Grade and 8 teams in 2nd Grade. QSDCA provided 4 affiliated teams in each Grade out of the total 14 teams that competed.

Congratulations go to Peninsula CC (Warehouse affiliated club) who defeated Coorparoo CC in First Grade and to Springwood Suns who defeated Brookfield United in Second Grade.

QSDCA Saturday Competition

The season consisted of 4 rounds of one-day limited over matches and 10 rounds of two day matches that led to semi finals and grand finals.

QSDCA featured 44 teams playing in 7 grades – B1, B2, B3, C1, C2, C3 and C4. All grades were keenly contested with many finals placings undecided until after the completion of fixtures.

Sunday Competitions

QSDCA ran three different Sunday competitions played on alternate Sundays to maximise player participation.

The 50 over Mel Lowings Cup was run on the alternate Sunday to the Geoff Doyle Cup Over 40's and Kookaburra Cup T20 competitions.

Mel Lowings Cup

This is a 50 over per team one day competition and featured two grades each of 6 teams.

Congratulations go to Mansfield Lions CC for winning the A grade (their 5th win in 6 seasons) and to Silent assassins for winning the B grade.

Kookaburra Cup T20 competition

Once again we are indebted to Kookaburra for their ongoing sponsorship for QSDCA and in particular this competition.

This season the Kookaburra Cup A grade was won by Mankadia Cricket Academy and the Kookaburra B grade shield was won by Brisbane Avengers CC.

Geoff Doyle Cup - Over 40's competition

Now in its third season of the QSDCA Over 40's Geoff Doyle Cup saw 14 teams in two grades (6 teams in A Grade and 8 teams in B Grade).

This competition is going from strength to strength and it is pleasing to see players stay involved with cricket.

Congratulations to Mansfield Lions CC for winning the A grade final and to Moggill CC for winning the B Grade final.

Plunkett Cup

This season saw only 4 teams compete in a 3 game season. Unfortunately, two of our three matches were washed out and we missed the final.

A great thank you to all those players who made themselves available for selection and also to Denis Golinski and Kanchan Bandyopadhyay who acted as selectors and to Mel Lowing for doing the scoring.

GROUNDS

The Association used 37 grounds throughout the season of which 34 were from QSDCA affiliated clubs.

Football again ran late and moved into the early part of our season once again as well as encroached into our season at various times throughout the season.

As a result, we were again fortunate to be able to hire grounds at Marchant Park and Seventh Brigade Park from Warehouse Cricket sometimes on very short notice. For this we thank Warehouse Cricket Association for their willingness to co-operate with our requirements.

In general, most cricket pitches were of good quality and the Association recognises the vital input from the many volunteers involved.

<u>UMPIRES</u>

Umpire numbers reduced to 23 for the season which included two new umpires in Denis Stirling and Pat Collins.


We would like to thank Matthew Skinner from Queensland Cricket for his support in the umpiring space, especially in provided two extra umpire observers in Brett Mortimer and Todd O'Rourke. These two people had a grounding in QSDCA cricket before moving to Premier Cricket as an A grade player in Brett and as an A grade umpire in Todd.

We need to single out our other observer and educator in Mel Johnson. Mel officially "retired" at the end of the season and has left some big shoes to fill both as an umpire observer, educator and mentor. Thank you Mel. The Mel Johnson Medal for the Umpire of the Year was won by Phil Somerville and the QSDCA most improved umpire was won by John Rossiter.

CONDUCTS

I am pleased to report that since the inception of the formal process the number of Code of behaviour reports from QSDCA matches has decreased. This is despite the increased number of fixtures and increased number of competitions we have run.

The Queensland Cricket Commission has started using the AFL-style system in 2023-24, which has led to a more streamlined and effective approach.

On receipt of a Code of Behaviour (COB) report the behaviour described in the report is deemed to be equivalent to a specific penalty.

The Commissioner now "offers" a penalty to the player and the player and his club committee may choose to accept this. If the player wishes to challenge the penalty, the original offer is no longer available and the result is a Commissioner hearing. The penalty may be greater or less than the original penalty.

If, after the Commissioner hearing, the player is not satisfied a tribunal of three new commissioners is set up.

Only one COB led to the third outcome in the 2023-24 season. The swift justice has appeared to 'unclog" the process.

Overall, the clubs (and captains) appear to have heeded the call for better behaviour and living the Spirit of Cricket.

The improvement in the number of COBs can also be attributed to umpires using different methods of managing players (based on speaking to a range of players across the range of clubs we represent) and the games have tended to run without the animosity of the past.

Finally the most common reasons for a COB have been:

- On the field dissent with the shock of receiving a decision that the player may deem "incorrect"
- Delayed dissent (resulting in damage to equipment or language) due to outcome of a decision (off the field).
- Abuse or Inappropriate Language directed at a player and/or official.

All of these events are manageable and controllable, so a little more to do in this space by captains, and clubs.




















MANAGEMENT COMMITTEE

The Management Committee meets at least once each month, either in person at Queensland Cricket Headquarters or by Zoom.

The migration of the electronic platform to PlayHQ for the teams and OfficialsHQ for the umpires for the first time created massive amounts of work for the Management Committee. It was a massive step for most clubs with a few clubs still thinking that they could "hold back the tide". The result of this was huge for the Management committee.

The Management committee spends more and more time each season on non cricket matters at each meeting.

We are embarking on a partnership with Queensland cricket whereby Queensland cricket will take on a number of tasks in the PlayHQ and OfficialHQ area. This will not come at no cost – each player will be levied for this service much the same as other sporting codes – although our cost will be at a very much reduced rate.

We are also being proactive in investigating other ways of player participation including, but not limited to, T10 night cricket, one day Saturday competitions and a synthetic pitch competition.

A special thank you must go to Anthony Martin for his work on the Management Committee. I know that this will embarrass him, but in this season just completed, Anthony spent up to 60 hours each week working on QSDCA matters – the majority on PlayHQ matters. This is why it is important that each Club abides by the regulations around player management. Thank you, Anthony.

Of course, there are others on the Committee including Mark Irwin who chairs Cricket Operations – quite often online from some remote part of the world. Also, Adam Brady and Marc Fidler for their assistance in this area and Kanchan for his assistance in the Conducts area. Not to mention our Honorary Treasurer, Keane White, who not only has the QSDCA clubs to administer but also the CCC side of things as well as our umpires.

QSDCA is in essence a small business and requires dedicated work by all Committee members.

Thanks go to all members of the Committee and hope that other QSDCA members will look to serve on the Committee for the coming season.

QUEENSLAND CRICKET

QSDCA acknowledges and is thankful for the support of Queensland Cricket.

The Directors, CEO and Staff continue to assist us in many ways with practical and moral support and this is much appreciated. The use of the lan Healy Room and the Queensland Cricket Board Room for QSDCA meetings, Management Committee meetings and Umpires meetings is greatly appreciated.

The ongoing provision of grant funding from Queensland Cricket is wisely spent by the QSDCA in provision of covers, mowers and renovation and building of new wicket blocks. QSDCA looks forward to progressing the game of cricket with a particular emphasis on participation. This is separate to the Community Cricket Championship that had eight out of fourteen QSDCA affiliated teams competing.

There has been a lot happening at Management Committee level. QSDCA is truly grateful to our sponsors –
