## PRESIDENT'S ANNUAL REPORT

On behalf of the Management Committee of the Queensland Sub Districts Cricket Association Inc., I present for your consideration the Annual Report and Financial Statements covering our activities for the 2024/2025 Cricket Season.

A total of 97 teams, from clubs affiliated with QSDCA, participated during the season in 15 grades spread over 6 competitions on Saturdays and Sundays. A total of 1959 players (up from 1802 from 2023/2024) were registered with QSDCA for the season.

Saturday matches were played by 60 teams (52 in QSDCA and 8 in CCC) over 9 grades (including CCC) as scheduled one-day and two-day matches. Sunday matches were played by 37 teams with two grades in each of the Kookaburra Cup Super 20, the Mel Lowings Cup 50 Over and the one grade Geoff Doyle Cup Over 40 Competitions being played on alternate Sundays. It was pleasing to see an increase in teams for the Sunday competitions.

Congratulations go to all Premiership winners. Further details are provided on Page 16 of this report.

## **SEASON FORMATS**

Starting on Saturday 21st September 2024, the season was played over 6 months with a three week break for Christmas and finals rounds completed at the end of March 2025.

### Community Cricket Championship (CCC) - Saturday Competition

The Community Cricket Championship (CCC) completed its fourth season in 2024/25. This is a contest between the best teams of various community cricket competitions - at this stage QSDCA and Warehouse. There was one 1st Grade with 10 teams of which 8 teams were affiliated with QSDCA. Congratulations to Gold Crest CC (Warehouse affiliated club) who defeated Brookfield CC in the grand final held over the weekend of March 22<sup>nd</sup> and 23<sup>rd</sup>.

### Saturday Competition - B and C Grade

The season consisted of 4 rounds of one-day limited over matches and 10 rounds of two day matches that led to semi-finals and grand finals in March. QSDCA featured 44 teams playing in 7 grades - B1, B2, B3, C1, C2, C3 and C4. All grades were keenly contested with many finals' placings undecided until after the completion of fixtures.

### Saturday Competition - 1 Day, 35 Over

This season's 1 day, 35 over competition had 8 teams competing in 16 rounds with Bulimba CC winning the final held on 22<sup>nd</sup> March.

### **Sunday Competitions**

QSDCA ran three different Sunday competitions played on alternate Sundays to maximise player participation. The 50 over Mel Lowings Cup was run on the alternate Sunday to the Geoff Doyle Cup Over 40's and Kookaburra Cup T20 competitions.

### Mel Lowings Cup

This is a 50-over per team one day competition and featured an A grade 6 team competition won by Tuskers CC and a B grade 8 team competition won by Kuraby Knights CC.

### Kookaburra Cup T20

We are indebted to Kookaburra for their ongoing sponsorship for QSDCA and this competition. Across 10 rounds the T20A grade consisted of 6 teams with Bleed Blue winning the grand final. The T20B grade had 7 teams with Napoleons CC winning the grand final.

### Geoff Doyle Cup - Over 40's

Now in its fourth season the Over 40's Geoff Doyle Cup saw 10 teams in one grade play 10 rounds with the grand final won by Mansfield Lions CC on 2<sup>nd</sup> March, 2025.

### SEQ Webb Shield

This season saw 5 teams compete in a five-match season - teams - QSDCA, Logan district, Warehouse and Toowoomba and Ipswich. Toowoomba finished at the top of the ladder. Appendix A provides a full summary of the Webb Shield games.

### **GROUNDS**

The Association used 41 grounds throughout the season of which 38 were from QSDCA affiliated clubs. Football and AFL again ran late and into the early part of the cricket season and continue to encroach at various times including at the end of the season providing an ongoing challenge allocating sufficient available grounds to all our competitions.

### **UMPIRES**

Umpire numbers increased to 31 for the season and included several new umpires, some of whom are still in training.

We would like to thank Matthew Skinner from Queensland Cricket for his support in the umpiring space. Jim Torpey, as part of his role with Queensland Cricket, took over from Mel Johnson as our umpire's educator and mentor. Jim's roots are in QSDCA where he played for many seasons from 1977 until he took up umpiring. His knowledge, particularly his local knowledge, is invaluable.

The Mel Johnson Medal for the Umpire of the Year was won by Anthony Martin and the QSDCA most improved umpire was won by John Vreke.

Anthony Martin, Bruce Lawson and Jim Torpey are working through the winter of 2025 to provide a structured approach for our umpiring group for the 2025/2026 season with an aim to make umpiring more attractive to retiring players and those wishing to get into umpiring

## **CONDUCTS REPORT**

The Conducts Sub-Committee of QSDCA has undertaken a broad remit in 2024-25 to uphold behavioural standards and ensure a consistent and transparent response to Code of Behaviour (COB) breaches across the QSDCA.

The period under review featured a mix of educational interventions, suspended penalties, and formal reprimands and suspensions. Several structural updates to disciplinary procedures were also implemented in line with Queensland Cricket's evolving Integrity Framework.

### Overview of Cases and Outcomes

- Total incidents reported: 25+
- Incidents resulting in suspension: 10
- Incidents resulting in official reprimand: 9
- Cases referred to Competition Management: 1

### **Nature of Breaches**

The majority of offences related to:

- Dissent toward umpiring decisions (Levels 1-3)
- Use of offensive or abusive language
- Conduct detrimental to the spirit of the game
- Failure of captains to control players
- Equipment abuse and unprofessional post-dismissal behaviour

Sanctions ranged from official reprimands and match suspensions (either immediate or suspended) to referrals for educational intervention. In some instances, penalties were held in abeyance until the end of the 2024-25 or 2025-26 seasons, reinforcing a framework of progressive discipline.

### **Notable Disciplinary Actions**

- Multiple suspensions were issued on 7 December 2024 for incidents in various Saturday grades, with players from 3 clubs receiving 1-2 match bans or reprimands for serious dissent and abusive conduct.
- Umpire conduct was also reviewed, with an official reprimand issued.

In February 2025, several players from 2 clubs received combined reprimands and multiple match suspensions for Level 2 breaches, with team captains also held accountable.

### Structural and Procedural Updates

- Code of Conduct references were updated in QSDCA and CCC Playing Regulations by September 2024.
- Queensland Cricket's Statewide Integrity Framework was introduced, separating "Game Day" and "Non-Game Day" incidents to clarify jurisdiction and procedure. The QSDCA's Conducts Liaison now coordinates directly with QC's Complaints Assessment Committee where necessary.

The Committee has also promoted greater education regarding match regulations following incidents suggesting knowledge gaps.

### **Forward Focus**

QSDCA remains committed to:

- Promoting respectful conduct and player accountability
- Supporting umpires and competition officials
- Ensuring due process and consistency in handling all disciplinary matters

It is recommended that education sessions on the updated Code of Behaviour and QSDCA Playing Regulations be implemented at the start of all seasons.

## PRESENTATION OF AWARDS EVENING

Once again, the evening was held at the Kedron Wavell RSL Club. It was attended by approximately 120 supporters on April 26<sup>th</sup> 2025. The proximity of Anzac Day and the proliferation of Public Holidays surrounding our date kept attendance down from the usual level. Notwithstanding, it was a great evening.

The evening was MC'd by Evan "Banger" Bancroft with our special guests being ex Test player Michael Kasprowicsz and ex Test Umpire Peter Parker.

Special thanks go to Jim Noble for organising the evening and for preparation of the trophies. We also thank our major sponsors: Kookaburra Sport, Keith Dudgeon Sports, Queensland Cricket and Aqua Fresh for supporting the night as well as all those players, club members, volunteers and administrators who help QSDCA thrive.

## MANAGEMENT COMMITTEE

The Management Committee meet at least once every month across the whole year, in person and online at Qld Cricket headquarters.

This season QSDCA partnered with Queensland Cricket who took on the roles of competition administration and the support component of the Management Committee. This was funded by a player levy and a contribution from our general funds. Initially the Competition Administration role was carried out by Andrew Keyte from Queensland Cricket and then from late November 2024 Andrea Pullar took over the role. Andrea has a community cricket background, having held a similar role with Bulimba Cricket Club. This has been a steep learning curve for both Queensland Cricket and QSDCA and the real benefits, as we continue to refine QSDCA's systems and processes, will be seen in the coming seasons.

For the Management Committee this has resulted in a reallocation of time and focus, facilitating an increased concentration on the overall running of QSDCA instead of the day-to-day operations.

A special thank you must go to Anthony Martin for his work on the Management Committee and for his work with Andrea Pullar to facilitate the implementation of the new partnership with QC.

Thanks also goes to Mark Irwin who chairs Cricket Operations - quite often online from some remote part of the world, Adam Brady and Marc Fidler for their assistance in general cricket operations and Kanchan Bandyopadhyay for his assistance in the Conducts area.

Our Honorary Treasurer, Keane White, provides considerable financial guidance and management with all our QSDCA clubs including CCC and the umpire group and his efforts and time are valuable to the sound running of QSDCA.

Thanks go to all members of the Committee, and we encourage other QSDCA members to serve on the Committee for the coming season.

## **QUEENSLAND CRICKET**

QSDCA acknowledges and is thankful for the support of Queensland Cricket.

We appreciate the practical and moral support provided by the Directors, CEO and Staff of QC. The use of the Ian Healy Room and the QC Board Room for QSDCA meetings, Management Committee meetings and Umpires meetings is greatly appreciated.

The ongoing provision of grant funding from QC is wisely spent by the QSDCA in provision of covers, mowers and renovation and building of new wicket blocks. This is of utmost importance to us as we are an all-turf competition and providing upkeep of turf cricket pitches is an expensive exercise.

Special thanks to Andrea Pullar, Matthew Skinner and Andrew Keyte from QC for their assistance throughout the last 12 months.



## **QSDCA ANNUAL FEEDBACK SURVEYS**

At the end of this season QSDCA issued 3 feedback surveys to gather information about the competition from our key membership base. A summary of results is provided below.

### Day/Night Survey

- 18 responses received

This season included the trial of the first day/night games held in the Sat 1 Day competition. Four games were completed and feedback was sought from the umpire, players and Clubs hosting the games. Key insights were:


- Strong support to continue to incorporate day/night fixtures into the competition.
- Lighting to a consistent 300 lux level is key to the success of the time change.
- Consideration needs to be given to start times to allow for challenges with visibility on dusk and the onset of dew on the fields as night conditions develop. This is relevant when the season has been affected by wet weather and the grounds are holding moisture.
- Ball colour preference favours the use of a pink ball
- Positive impacts for Clubs who can host games, open canteens and have families and other visitors come down to watch games.

### **Umpire Survey**

- 14 out of 29 responses received

Our QSDCA umpires expressed a high level of satisfaction with their involvement in the competition and we are encouraged that all would recommend QSDCA to other interested umpires. As a result of the feedback QSDCA are reviewing changes to:

- Umpire uniform to standardise appearance across the competition
- Structured meeting program and schedule for the season that also allows for some off-site and more social meetings, guest speakers and dedicated topics for training
- Increased training and support for umpires to ensure consistency of service across all grades
- Communication improvements such as a dedicated Umpire's What's app and regular correspondence between QSDCA and the umpire group



### All Participant's Survey

138 out of 1,323 responses received

This survey yielded consistent results in terms of what participants liked and what they would like to see improved about the QSDCA competition. Key insights were:

 Overall, respondents enjoy playing with their mates, access to turf pitches, friendly competition and the range of formats available as the top 3 reasons they like QSDCA cricket (image below reflects most common words used)



- There is strong demand for increasing the umpire base so that all games across all formats have at least one umpire per game, every week.
- Numerous requests relating to balls, playing times, and improvements to standards of grounds were made and have been reviewed as part of the yearly Playing Regulations Review and other pre-season preparations.
- 75% of respondents would recommend the competition to other players looking to join a cricket competition.

The Committee is keen to continue the annual process of feedback surveys as standard practice for the competition with the feedback providing valuable suggestions that focus efforts on improvements to the next season. Over many seasons the data can be used to highlight trends, identify weaknesses and build a picture of what characterises QSDCA cricket for all our members.

## IN CONCLUSION

QSDCA continues to provide great sport and recreation for over 2000 cricketers each summer with all matches played on turf pitches.

The Saturday team numbers are steady, whilst Sunday fixtures in the 50 Over Mel Lowings Cup divisions, Geoff Doyle Cup Over 40's and the Kookaburra Cup Super20 fixtures continue to grow.

QSDCA looks forward to progressing the game of cricket with a particular emphasis on participation. This is separate to the Community Cricket Championship that had eight out of ten QSDCA affiliated teams competing.

There has been a lot happening at Management Committee level. QSDCA is keen to progress day/night and night cricket with at least 4 grounds now suitable for night cricket. QSDCA will be investigating T10 cricket on Friday nights for both men and women.

## APPENDIX A – REP CRICKET ANNUAL REPORT 2024-2025

After a wet 2023-24 season, where only one match of Webb Shield Cricket was played, this 2024-2025 season saw QSDCA Rep side grow from each outing.

Game 1: QSDCA lost to Toowoomba by 23 runs



The 1st game of the Rep season did not go as planned, with a loss to Toowoomba who had some very classy batters at the top of their order. Toowoomba's Brian May "Bush Bradman" showed his class with a well compiled 55, before being caught by Jack Mitchell off Chris White. Prior to this, we bowled extremely well, with debutants Luke Bartholomew (1/13 off 5) and Liam White (3/20 off his ten) doing some damage to the middle order.
