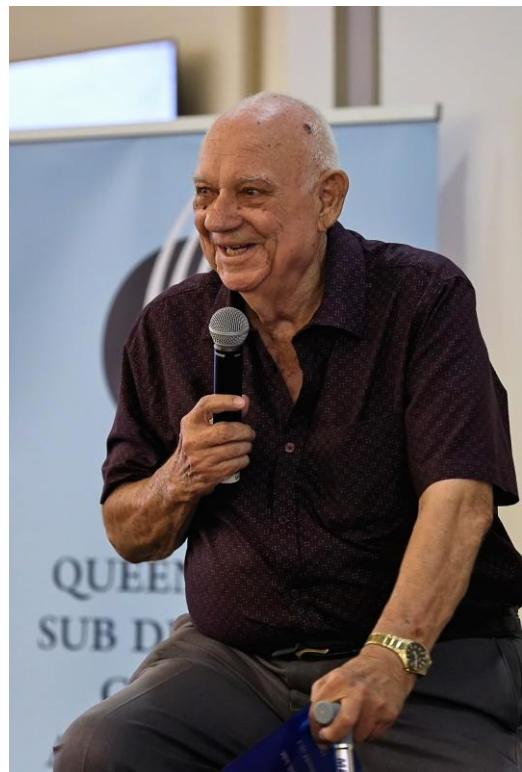

PRESIDENT'S ANNUAL REPORT

On behalf of the Management Committee of the Queensland Sub Districts Cricket Association Inc. (QSDCA), I am pleased to present the Annual Report and Financial Statements for the 2025/2026 cricket season.

The 2025/2026 season was another strong and successful year for QSDCA, highlighted by continued growth in player participation, expansion of our Sunday competitions, utilising the night cricket space and ongoing collaboration with Queensland Cricket and our valued stakeholders.

A total of **92 teams** from QSDCA-affiliated clubs participated across **13 grades** and **5 competitions**, conducted over Friday night, Saturdays and Sundays throughout the season.

Player participation was **1539 unique registered players**.

Saturday competitions featured **58 teams**, comprising:

- **52 teams** competing in QSDCA competitions; and
- **6 teams** participating in the Community Cricket Championship (CCC).

These matches were played across **8 grades (7 in QSDCA and 1 grade in CCC)**, incorporating both one-day and two-day formats.

Sunday competitions featured **34 teams**, competing across:

- the **Kookaburra Cup Super 20** (2 grades)
- the **Mel Lowings Cup 50 Over Competition** (1 grade)
- the **Geoff Doyle Cup Over 40's Competition** (2 grades)

These competitions were scheduled on alternate Sundays to maximise player participation and ground availability. It was particularly pleasing to see continued growth in Sunday cricket participation across all formats.

Congratulations are extended to all Premiership-winning clubs and players. Further details are contained later in this report.

SEASON FORMATS

Starting on Saturday 20th September 2025, the season was played over 6 months with a three-week break for Christmas and finals rounds completed at the end of March 2026.

Saturday Competition - A, B and C Grade

The Saturday season was conducted over **24 weekends**, with:

- **6 QSDCA-affiliated teams** competing in the 8 team CCC competition.
- **52 teams** competing in seven QSDCA grades from A2 through to C3.

The QSDCA Saturday competition consisted of:

- four rounds of limited overs one-day cricket; and
- ten rounds of two-day cricket,

culminating in semi-finals and grand finals across all grades.

The competition featured **52 teams** competing across:

- A2, B1, B2, B3, C1, C2 and C3 Grades

All grades were keenly contested, with many finals' positions remaining undecided until the final rounds of competition.

Community Cricket Championship (CCC) - Saturday Competition

The Community Cricket Championship completed its fourth season and continues to provide a high-quality competition involving leading community cricket clubs from QSDCA and Warehouse Cricket.

- **First Grade** - 8 teams

QSDCA provided 6 affiliated teams in the CCC competition.

Sunday Competitions

QSDCA again conducted three separate Sunday competitions, played on alternate weekends to maximise player participation opportunities

Mel Lowings Cup

The Mel Lowings Cup featured one grade of nine teams competing in a 50-over format. Congratulations to:

Geoff Doyle Cup - Over 40's

The Geoff Doyle Cup continued to grow strongly in its fourth season, featuring:

- 6 teams in A Grade; and
- 5 teams in B Grade.

This competition continues to provide an outstanding opportunity for players to remain actively involved in cricket beyond traditional competitive pathways. Congratulations to:

Plunkett Cup

Due to a change in format to a Friday night competition, QSDCA did not enter a team in this competition.

Day-Night & Night Cricket

During the season, QSDCA took an important step forward by expanding into the day/night cricket space. Due to the current limitations associated with pink-ball cricket, these fixtures were initially confined to T20 and limited overs one-day matches.

On two occasions, as a result of ground availability constraints, QSDCA successfully conducted double-header fixtures at Gibson Park North. The first match commenced at 10:00am, followed by the second fixture at 3:40pm.

These matches were extremely well received by players and clubs alike, generating strong enthusiasm for the format and the atmosphere created by night cricket. As a result of this success, QSDCA will introduce a standalone Friday night T20 competition next season especially with Gibson Park South now being ready for night cricket.

The use of day/night one-day matches, and double-header scheduling will continue to be explored as practical solutions to ongoing ground availability challenges throughout the season.

In addition, the Management Committee is currently working closely with Kookaburra to source a suitable ball capable of supporting traditional two-day cricket in a day/night format, with the long-term objective of expanding day/night fixtures across additional competitions.

GROUNDS

The Association used 45 grounds throughout the season of which 37 were from QSDCA affiliated clubs. The continuing overlap of football seasons again impacted cricket ground availability during the early part of the season and intermittently throughout the year. As a result, QSDCA was fortunate to secure additional access to grounds through Warehouse Cricket Association at Marchant Park. We thank Laurence Christie from Warehouse for his assistance in securing these grounds

Overall, playing surfaces and turf wickets were of a high standard throughout the season. The Association acknowledges the outstanding contribution made by the many volunteers and grounds personnel who maintain these facilities.

UMPIRES

Umpire numbers remained steady at **30 officials** during the season, including several new umpires. QSDCA extends its appreciation to Matthew Skinner from Queensland Cricket for his continued support of umpire development initiatives.

Jim Torpey again assumed the role of umpire educator and mentor. Jim's longstanding association with QSDCA, both as a player and umpire, provides invaluable knowledge and leadership to our umpiring group. Congratulations to:

- Brett Griffin - recipient of the Mel Johnson Medal for Umpire of the Year
- Rick White - recipient of the Most Improved Umpire Award

During the 2026 winter period, Anthony Martin, Bruce Lawson and Jim Torpey are working collaboratively to further develop a structured and sustainable umpire development for the 2026/2027 season, with a particular focus on attracting retiring players and new participants into umpiring framework for the 2026/2027 season.

CONDUCTS REPORT

The Conducts Committee has undertaken a broad remit in 2025-26 to uphold behavioural standards and ensure a consistent and transparent response to Code of Behaviour (COB) breaches across the QSDCA.

The period under review featured a high volume of disciplinary matters across multiple grades and competitions, with a continued mix of official reprimands, suspended penalties, and immediate match suspensions. Several charges were withdrawn or downgraded following hearings, reflecting thorough and fair due process.

Overview of Cases and Outcomes

- Total incidents reported: 26
- Incidents resulting in suspension: 15
- Incidents resulting in official reprimand: 7

Nature of Breaches

The majority of offences related to:

- Dissent toward umpiring decisions (Levels 1-3)
- Use of offensive or abusive language
- Conduct detrimental to the spirit of the game
- Failure of captains to control players
- Equipment abuse and unprofessional post-dismissal behaviour

Sanctions ranged from official reprimands and match suspensions (either immediate or suspended) to charges being withdrawn or dismissed. In many instances, penalties were suspended and will hold until the 2026-27 season, reinforcing a framework of progressive discipline.

Notable Disciplinary Actions

- A significant cluster of matters arose from December 2025 fixtures, including players facing charges of dissent, abusive language, and equipment abuse across A2, B2, C1, and Over-40s grades. Several charges were downgraded or withdrawn following hearings.
- Equipment abuse and post-dismissal conduct remained prevalent throughout the season, with incidents recorded across B3, C3, MLC50, and Over-40s competitions.

Structural and Procedural Updates

- Captain accountability was actively applied during the season, with several captains issued official reprimands or facing charges under the “Captain’s Responsible” regulation where player conduct was not appropriately managed.
- Queensland Cricket’s Statewide Integrity Framework continued to guide procedure, with the QSDCA’s Conducts Liaison coordinating directly with QC’s Complaints Assessment Committee where necessary, particularly for higher-level or cross-competition incidents.
- Umpire notification was confirmed across all finalised matters, maintaining transparency and supporting the officiating community throughout the season.

Forward Focus

The Committee remains committed to:

- Promoting respectful conduct and player accountability
- Supporting umpires and competition officials
- Ensuring due process and consistency in handling all disciplinary matters

It is recommended that education sessions on the updated Code of Behaviour and QSDCA Playing Regulations be considered at the start of each season.

Special recognition is extended to Anthony Martin for his considerable contribution throughout the season, particularly with assisting the implementation of the Queensland Cricket administrative partnership.

QSDCA ANNUAL FEEDBACK SURVEYS

At the end of this season QSDCA issued 2 feedback surveys to gather information about the competition from our key membership base. A summary of results is provided below.

Umpire Survey

- 17 out of 31 responses received

Our QSDCA umpires continue to express a high level of satisfaction with their involvement in the competition. As a result of the feedback QSDCA are reviewing changes to:

- Recruitment of a higher number of umpires to ensure more games have an official present
- Continuing improvements to umpire education and training

All Participant's Survey

- 88 out of 1,534 responses received

This survey yielded consistent results in terms of what participants liked and what they would like to see improved about the QSDCA competition. Key insights were:

- Respondents continue to express their enjoyment of subbies cricket because it provides the opportunity to play cricket and socialise with good mates, the standard of the grounds and facilities is generally very high, friendly competition and the range of teams and Clubs involved that leads to a good standard of competition.
- The increase in umpires across many of the rounds this season has been noted and well received.
- Respondents to the survey provided a considerable amount of feedback about balls, formats, draws and rule changes that the Committee has been working through ahead of Season 26-27.
- 82% of respondents would recommend the competition to other players looking to join a cricket competition.

The Annual Feedback Surveys are a great way for the QSDCA Committee to gather feedback from the wider playing group and start to identify trends across the seasons that inform decisions on changes and modifications to each season. Participants involvement in these surveys is greatly appreciated.

IN CONCLUSION

QSDCA continues to provide outstanding cricket and recreational opportunities for more than 1,500 cricketers each summer, with all matches played on turf wickets.

Saturday competition numbers remained stable throughout the season, while participation in:

- the Mel Lowings Cup 50 Over competition
- the Geoff Doyle Cup Over 40's competition
- the Kookaburra Cup Super 20 competition

continued to grow strongly.

The Association remains committed to expanding participation opportunities and further strengthening community cricket pathways.

At Management Committee level, significant progress has been made across governance, administration and strategic planning initiatives.

QSDCA is also committed to the continued development of day/night and night cricket, with a number of T20 night fixtures and Day/Night One Day fixtures being played at Gibson park and Wally Tate Oval. Importantly, the Association will investigate the introduction of:

- Friday night T20 cricket
- expanded participation opportunities for both men and women.
